Matthew 7:24-27: <sup>24</sup> "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. <sup>25</sup> The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. <sup>26</sup> But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. <sup>27</sup> The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash."

How many times have we sung the hymn, "HOW FIRM A FOUNDATION"?

Remember this verse:

"How firm a foundation, ye Saints of the Lord is laid for your faith in his excellent word!"

Two farmers from western Kansas were joking about the difference between agriculture and farming. "They are the same," they said, "except farming is doing it." What's the difference between theology and thanksgiving? They are the same, except thanksgiving is doing it. Those who are built up in Christ "abound in thanksgiving." 
