#### SUNDAY SCHOOL

We learned about being thankful to God for everything by studying 1 Kings 17. God shows us how He works in all times and situations and how he challenges us to increase our faith. God prepares Elijah for service by hiding him where he learns to depend on God. In faith he must accept the food brought to him by the unclean ravens. He sends Elijah to Zarephath, the center of Baal worship and home of Queen Jezebel at a time when King Ahab was trying to kill him. God sends him to the home of a poor Gentile widow and challenges her to provide food for the prophet as she is preparing a last meal of bread for her and her son. When the widow steps out in faith to follow the word of God and puts serving God first in her life, God provides a miracle. God blesses her with a flour bin that is never empty and an oil jar that never runs dry. When the widow's faith is tested by the death of her son, God responds to the prayers of Elijah with another miracle by restoring life to the boy. Their faith is strengthened as they see firsthand God's power to provide for our needs and even overcome death. Our God is mighty to save!
