IKC NEWS

(from the IK Conference UCC newsletter, "Inky E-News") Dear Friends.

There are so many positive activities within the IKC, and I feel gratitude every time I think of them. First and foremost, I want to give you an update about a very exciting opportunity which the Board approved during their last meeting. On June 1, 2015, the Rev. Phil Hart will join the IKC staff as part-time conference minister to begin an experimental, shared administrative role.

The following describes the covenant, in which, we will be a first in the life of the wider church. I am very grateful for Phil's thoughtful, creative, inspiring approach and study regarding the Church and how it is changing. I believe this gives the IKC an active role in shaping our own conference, as well as conferences throughout the denomination. We all know we are in a period of change and that sometimes brings about fear, frustration and just plain angst. I hope you will join me in looking upon this adventure as a time of discovery, creative thought and hopeful implementation. I look forward to the new shapes that will evolve from this joint leadership and study. Please join me in welcoming the Rev. Phil Hart. More information about Phil will be posted on the IKC website.

Description and Design of the Experiment:

The entire Church is in a period of change. We can see this from the local church setting to the National offices. The challenge is how to respond to these changes that do not simply "manage" our structure, but improve our ability to live out our mission. Both the Indiana-Kentucky Conference and the Ohio Conference are in unique positions. The opportunity is to try something different that has the real possibility of

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improving our work and collaboration, decrease our administrative costs, and increase funds available for our communities.

<u>Guiding Question: Can two Conferences share Executive Leadership?"</u>

<u>Experiment</u>: The Indiana-Kentucky Conference and the Ohio Conference of the United Church of Christ enter into a period where they share a Conference Minister.

<u>Design</u>:

- Indiana-Kentucky Conference (IKC) covenant with the Ohio Conference (OC) to share a Conference Minister.
- IKC covenants to share the costs for ½ of the Conference Minister's package.
- IKC will also budget related costs such as travel, housing, etc. for the Conference Minister's work within the IKC boundaries.
- Additional funds will be sought from the National Church or other avenues to offset other costs of the project.
- The initial length of the project will be six months with a period of evaluation at the three month mark.
- The Conferences will continue to seek additional areas of collaboration and partnership that might be effective including, disaster ministries, outdoor/faith formation ministries, church development and work with the Innovation Lab project.
- A "Covenant Committee" will be developed with three members from each conference. The task of the Covenant Committee will be to oversee the project, quickly deal with issues as they arise, counsel the Conference Minister in his duties and work, facilitate and arbitrage differences among the two conferences.
- At the six-month evaluation, the Conferences will determine if:
 - 1. They end the project
 - 2. They extend the project
 - 3. They enter into discussions about making the arrangement more permanent

The National Offices of the UCC will assist the Conferences in these discussions and provide whatever services they can to ensure the success of the project.

As you can see, this is a very full plan for the sixmonth experimental period of time. The enthusiasm and thoughtful support by all of the IKC will bring opportunities that we have not had the time or energy to pursue during the past few years. I ask for support, many prayers and your thoughtful comments as we join in this venture with the Ohio Conference.

As you know, the Annual Gathering is quickly approaching which will provide ample time for comments, thoughts added to a Dream Board and reconnecting with friends we seldom have the opportunity to enjoy. I wish you a joyful Annual Gathering period, thank the planning committee profusely and look forward to many happy times as we prayerfully and gracefully engage in the work of the IKC. Best wishes to each of you and may you rejoice in the wonderful opportunities and challenges that God brings to this wonderful conference and the great people that make up the IKC. *Sincerely, Joyce A.
